

Search Page

A – enter the rating (classification) for the goods to be exported. This needs to be down to the lowest sub-head. If in doubt, this can be clarified using the ‘Goods Checker’ tool

B – the control text for the goods classification will be shown as it appears in the strategic control lists. The associated notes etc are not shown

C – enter the end user destination

D – enter the consignee destination (if applicable)

E – after selecting the rating and end user (also consignee where applicable) destination click on ‘Next’

List of OGELs

A – the Checker will display a list of the OGELs that may apply for the goods rating and destination that you selected on the ‘Search Page’

B – gives users the option to print out the list of available OGELs. The printout will also show the goods rating and destination the user selected

C – this gives a brief description as to what the OGEL is for

D – this will help the user check through the conditions that must be complied with in order to use the OGEL

E – click on the title to go directly to a pdf file of the current OGEL on the ECO web site

EXAMPLE – Military Goods

Conditional Ratings

A – the rating selected was ML5a. In the Military Goods OGEL, the list of goods that can be exported is limited to only certain goods in ML5a. The Checker will always display these ‘conditional’ ratings and give the user a question to answer to ensure their goods are included in the OGEL

B – in this example, if your items are on the list of eligible goods the answer to the question needs to be ‘Yes’. If ‘No’ was entered, the Checker will inform the user that this OGEL cannot be used for the export (see Page 4)

OGEL Conditions

A – once an OGEL has been selected, the Checker will take users through a series of questions on each condition the OGEL contains. At any stage during this, the user can opt to view a complete list of the conditions and, should they wish, print this out

B – the Checker separates out all the conditions of an OGEL and details them individually. The user is then asked a question to clarify whether they can use the OGEL

C – where the OGEL document contains defined terms, these can be accessed by the user wherever the term appears in a condition. By clicking on the link a text box will appear containing the definition/s

OGEL Conditions

A – within the text of a condition, reference may be made to another condition that the OGEL contains. To prevent the user having to manually search for these, the Checker will display a 'pop-up' screen containing the text of the other condition. References to other conditions in the text are always shown in bold, and the pop-up box will appear if the user places their cursor over the bold text

Note – some references can also be made to only part of another condition in the OGEL e.g. in this example it is Condition 1 (b). The Checker tool is set up to incorporate this and, in such cases, it only displays that part of the condition in the pop-up box

Completion of condition questions

If all conditions can be complied with, the Checker informs the user that they may be able to use the OGEL selected

A – the user can view a document of all the Checker conditions of the OGEL (including any 'Conditional Ratings' that applied), together with a copy of their answers to the questions they were asked. This will also show the goods rating, destination and details of the dates of the OGEL selected. They can then choose to print this out as part of an audit trail

B – this takes the user to a pdf file of the current OGEL on the ECO web site

Unable to comply with the OGEL conditions

If having selected an OGEL, the user provides an answer to any of the questions that shows they cannot comply with the OGEL (this applies to 'Conditional Rating' questions as well), they are informed the selected OGEL cannot be used for the export. The user then has three options:

A – to return to the list of possible OGELs for the export (as in Page 1) so they can consider whether another OGEL may be used

B – to apply for a Standard Individual export licence. By clicking on this, the Checker will automatically take the user to the Export Control Organisation electronic licensing webpage

C – to check to see if your company holds an OIEL
